2011-12 Preseason Notes

Looking To Build: The Purple Aces have made the postseason two out of the last three years, something the program has not done since qualifying for the NCAA Tournament in 1992 and 93 and are looking for an experienced team to take the next step this year.

Evansville posted an impressive 4-2 mark against NCAA Tournament teams last season, including a 71-68 win over eventual national championship finalist Butler, a sweep in the regular season series over MVC Tournament champion Indiana State and a win over regular season champ Missouri State, one of just three league losses for the Bears.

Other accomplishments from last season included a CBI victory over Hofstra marking the first postseason win for UE since the 1989 NCAA Tournament and a 9-9 mark in the MVC, the best league record for UE since 2000-01.

Colt Leads The Way: Junior Colt Ryan established himself as one of the top players in the Missouri Valley Conference, averaging 15.7 PPG last season, third best in the league. For his efforts, he was named to the Preseason All-Conference Team for this season. As a sophomore, Ryan led the MVC in free throw percentage, hitting 87.4% of his attempts while his conversion rate of 40.6% from three-point range was fifth.

A New Era: Evansville is set to open a new phase in its program with the opening of the Ford Center in downtown Evansville. For the past 55 years, the Purple Aces have called Roberts Stadium their home. UE owned a 604-231 mark at Roberts and will look to carry that home court success over to the new venue.

Big Start At The Ford Center: Following a pair of exhibition games, the Aces will officially open up the Ford Center with games against Butler and Indiana. The regular season begins on November 12 when defending national finalist Butler comes to town. Last year, UE took a 71-68 win over the 23rd-ranked Bulldogs at Hinkle Fieldhouse. Four days later, the Hoosiers will make their first trip to Evansville since the 1995-96 season.

Solid Non-Conference Slate: The 11-game non-conference schedule features at least five teams who advanced to postseason play in 2011 with eight games to be held at the Ford Center. After opening against Butler and IU, the Aces will play host to Oakland City before taking to the road for the first time against UIC.

Defending SWAC champion Alabama State will come to Evansville on Nov. 29 before future Big East member TCU arrives in town on Dec. 3. A return trip to reigning Elite Eight program UNC awaits the Purple Aces on the 6th before home games against North Carolina A&T and Tennessee Tech and a road contest at Miami-Ohio wrap up the pre-Christmas schedule for UE. Evansville will once again play an ESPN Bracketbuster game in February. The date and opponent will be announced at a later time.

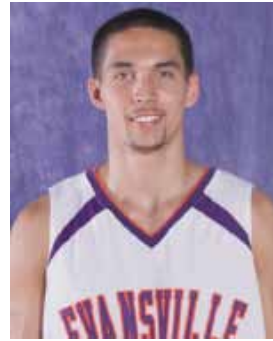

IT DIDN'T TAKE MARTY SIMMONS LONG TO GO FROM TALKING ABOUT SUCCESS TO ACTUALLY ACHIEVING IT. SINCE RETURNING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF EVANSVILLE AS HEAD COACH IN 2007, SIMMONS HAS (1) LED THE ACES TO POST-SEASON PLAY TWO OF THE PAST THREE YEARS, (2) PRODUCED TWO .500-OR-BETTER SEASONS, SOMETHING THAT HAD NOT TAKEN PLACE AT UE SINCE 2000, (3) PRODUCED EVANSVILLE'S BEST MISSOURI VALLEY CONFERENCE RECORD SINCE 2001, AND (4) GUIDED THE ACES TO A 4-2 RECORD LAST SEASON AGAINST NCAA TOURNAMENT TEAMS. ONE OF THOSE FOUR VICTORIES WAS OVER NCAA RUNNER-UP BUTLER AT THE BULLDOGS' HINKLE FIELDHOUSE. IN EACH OF THE PAST TWO SEASONS, EVANSVILLE HAS DEFEATED A TEAM THAT WENT ON TO BEAT A #1 SEED IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT (NORTHERN IOWA OVER KANSAS IN 2009-10 AND BUTLER OVER PITTSBURGH IN 2010-11).

SIMMONS' SUCCESS HAS BEEN NOTICED BY HIS PEERS. IN TWO OF THE PAST THREE YEARS, HE HAS FINISHED AMONG THE TOP FOUR IN VOTING FOR MISSOURI VALLEY CONFERENCE COACH OF THE YEAR. THE LATEST EXAMPLE TOOK PLACE IN 2011 WHEN SIMMONS' PURPLE ACES FINISHED 9-9 IN THE MVC AND IN SIXTH PLACE AFTER BEING VOTED 10TH IN THE PRE-SEASON POLL. THE ACES WENT ON TO ACHIEVE THEIR FIRST POST-SEASON VICTORY SINCE 1989 BY DEFEATING HOFSTRA IN THE FIRST ROUND OF THE COLLEGE BASKETBALL INVITATIONAL.

SIMMONS RETURNED TO HIS ALMA MATER AS HEAD COACH IN THE SPRING OF 2007. HIS FIRST SQUAD FINISHED 9-21, BUT ONE YEAR LATER, IN 2008-09, SIMMONS LED HIS ACES TO A 17-14 RECORD AND A BERTH IN THE INAUGURAL COLLEGEINSIDER.COM POST-SEASON TOURNAMENT. FOR HIS EFFORTS, SIMMONS FINISHED THIRD IN BALLOTING FOR MVC COACH OF THE YEAR, TRAILING ONLY THE COACHES WHO LED THEIR TEAMS TO A CO-CHAMPIONSHIP. THE 2008-09 ACES ACHIEVED EVANSVILLE'S BEST WINNING PERCENTAGE SINCE 2000, AND FIRST POST-SEASON APPEARANCE SINCE 1999, WHEN SIMMONS WAS AN ASSISTANT COACH WITH THE ACES. SENIOR SHY ELY WAS SECOND IN VOTING FOR MISSOURI VALLEY CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE YEAR, AND SENIOR JASON HOLSINGER EARNED ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA HONORS.

PRIOR TO HIS RETURN TO EVANSVILLE IN 2007, SIMMONS SERVED AS HEAD COACH FOR FIVE YEARS AT DIVISION II SOUTHERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY-EDWARDSVILLE, WHERE HE TOOK OVER A PROGRAM THAT HAD NOT WON 10 GAMES SINCE 1999 AND LED THE COUGARS TO 23 WINS IN 2005 AND 25 IN 2006. SIUE REACHED THE NCAA TOURNAMENT IN 2005 FOR THE FIRST TIME IN 15 YEARS, AND SIMMONS WAS CHOSEN AS GREAT LAKES VALLEY COACH OF THE YEAR. HIS 2006 SQUAD DID EVEN BETTER, WINNING THREE GAMES IN THE NCAA DIVISION II GREAT LAKES REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS AND ADVANCING TO THE ELITE EIGHT. SIUE APPEARED IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS 16 WEEKS.

A NATIVE OF LAWRENCEVILLE, ILL., SIMMONS LED LAWRENCEVILLE HIGH SCHOOL TO BACK TO BACK CLASS A STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS AND BECAME ONE OF THE MOST CELEBRATED PLAYERS IN ILLINOIS PREP HISTORY. SIMMONS SPENT HIS FIRST TWO YEARS OF COLLEGE AT INDIANA. IT WAS DURING INDIANA'S NIT RUN IN 1985 WHEN INDIANA UNIVERSITY ASSISTANT COACH JIM CREWS WAS CHOSEN AS EVANSVILLE'S HEAD COACH. TWO MONTHS LATER, SIMMONS TRANSFERRED TO EVANSVILLE. ALREADY DESIGNATED AS THE ACES' TEAM CAPTAIN WHILE SITTING OUT HIS REDSHIRT SEASON, SIMMONS IMMEDIATELY HELPED TURN AROUND THE UE PROGRAM WHEN HE BECAME ELIGIBLE IN 1986-87. HE AVERAGED 22.4 POINTS AS A JUNIOR AND LED EVANSVILLE TO A FIRST PLACE TIE IN THE MIDWESTERN COLLEGIATE CONFERENCE. AS A SENIOR, HE FINISHED SIXTH IN THE NATION IN SCORING AT 25.9, AND FINISHED NINTH IN BALLOTING FOR THE ASSOCIATED PRESS COLLEGE BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR. DESPITE PLAYING ONLY TWO SEASONS AT EVANSVILLE, HE RANKS 22ND WITH 1,265 POINTS.

JIMMY ELGAS
ILLINOIS STATE '93
FIFTH SEASON

A MIDWEST NATIVE AND FORMER STAFF MEMBER AT KANSAS STATE AND UTAH, JIMMY ELGAS BEGAN HIS COACHING CAREER AT AGE 20 AT ILLINOIS STATE UNIVERSITY, SERVING AS A STUDENT ASSISTANT COACH FOR THE REDBIRDS. HE THEN SERVED AS ASSISTANT COACH AT LINCOLN (ILL.) COLLEGE FROM 1993-1995 AND TEXAS STATE UNIVERSITY FROM 1995-2000. TEXAS STATE WON TWO SOUTHLAND CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS WITH COACH ELGAS ON THE STAFF, AND REACHED THE 1997 NCAA TOURNAMENT. HE STEPPED UP TO THE KANSAS STATE PROGRAM IN THE BIG 12 CONFERENCE IN 2000, FIRST AS DIRECTOR OF BASKETBALL OPERATIONS FOR TWO YEARS BEFORE EARNING A PROMOTION TO ASSISTANT COACH FROM 2002-2006.

COACH ELGAS HELPED RECRUIT THREE NATIONALLY RANKED RECRUITING CLASSES TO KANSAS STATE, INCLUDING HOOP SCOOP'S NUMBER ONE RATED CLASS IN 2003. HE ALSO SERVED AS KANSAS STATE'S INTERIM HEAD COACH FOR TWO GAMES IN FEBRUARY, 2006. COACH ELGAS JOINED ANOTHER NATIONALLY KNOWN PROGRAM IN 2006, AT THE UNIVERSITY OF UTAH, BEFORE COACH SIMMONS CONVINCED HIM TO RETURN TO HIS MIDWEST ROOTS AS AN ASSISTANT COACH FOR THE PURPLE ACES. ORIGINALLY FROM CRYSTAL LAKE, ILLINOIS, HE AND HIS WIFE, TAMARA, HAVE TWO CHILDREN—KYLA AND JAMES, AND ARE EXPECTING THEIR THIRD CHILD LATE THIS WINTER.

THIRD SEASON

CARSON HARRIS WILL BEGIN HIS THIRD YEAR AS PART OF THE UNIVERSITY OF EVANSVILLE BASKETBALL PROGRAM IN 2011-12. HE WAS PROMOTED FROM DIRECTOR OF BASKETBALL OPERATIONS TO ASSISTANT COACH IN SEPTEMBER OF 2010, SOON AFTER ASSISTANT COACH BEN WIERZBA TOOK OVER AS HEAD COACH AT THE UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS-SPRINGFIELD. HARRIS JOINED THE UE STAFF IN 2009 AS DIRECTOR OF BASKETBALL OPERATIONS.

A THREE-TIME ALL-NORTH CENTRAL CONFERENCE GUARD AT LAFAYETTE JEFF HIGH SCHOOL AND A THREE-TIME ALL-HEARTLAND COLLEGIATE ATHLETIC CONFERENCE SELECTION AT MANCHESTER (IND.) COLLEGE, HARRIS STAYED ON AT MANCHESTER AS AN ASSISTANT COACH FOR TWO YEARS FOLLOWING HIS GRADUATION IN 2001. HE THEN COACHED THREE YEARS AT EARLHAM COLLEGE AND THREE YEARS AT DEPAUW UNIVERSITY BEFORE MAKING THE MOVE TO THE DIVISION I LEVEL IN THE SUMMER OF 2009.



CHRIS HOLLENDER
EVANSVILLE '98
THIRD SEASON

UNIVERSITY OF EVANSVILLE GRADUATE CHRIS HOLLENDER RETURNED TO HIS ALMA MATER IN 2009 AFTER SERVING THE PREVIOUS SEVEN YEARS UNDER FORMER UE COACH JIM CREWS AT ARMY. AN ALL-MISSOURI VALLEY CONFERENCE SELECTION IN 1998, HOLLENDER SCORED 1,029 POINTS AT EVANSVILLE IN JUST THREE SEASONS. HEAD COACH MARTY SIMMONS WAS AN ASSISTANT COACH AT UE DURING TWO OF THOSE THREE YEARS.

HOLLENDER SPENT HIS FRESHMAN YEAR OF COLLEGE AT LAKE LAND (ILL.) COLLEGE IN HIS HOMETOWN OF MATTOON, ILL. BEFORE EMBARKING ON HIS THREE-YEAR CAREER AT UE. IN ADDITION TO EARNING ALL-MVC HONORS AND LEADING THE LEAGUE IN FIELD GOAL PERCENTAGE (.548) AS A SENIOR, HOLLENDER WAS CAPTAIN OF THE MVC MOST IMPROVED TEAM IN 1998 AFTER HIS SCORING AVERAGE ROSE FROM 11.8 AS A JUNIOR TO 16.5 AS A SENIOR. IN 84 CAREER GAMES, WHICH INCLUDED 70 STARTING ASSIGNMENTS, HOLLENDER AVERAGED 12.3 POINTS AND 5.9 REBOUNDS. HE RANKS 42ND IN CAREER SCORING FOR THE ACES.

AFTER GRADUATING WITH A DEGREE IN MARKETING, HOLLENDER SPENT ONE SEASON WITH BREMERHAVEN IN GERMANY BEFORE JOINING THE ST. LOUIS SWARM OF THE INTERNATIONAL BASKETBALL LEAGUE. THE SWARM WON THE IBL CHAMPIONSHIP IN EACH OF HOLLENDER'S TWO SEASONS WITH THE CLUB (1999-2000, 2000-01). HE THEN SIGNED ON WITH THE ROCKFORD LIGHTNING OF THE CONTINENTAL BASKETBALL ASSOCIATION, WHERE HE PLAYED 14 GAMES DURING THE 2001-02 SEASON BEFORE STARTING HIS COACHING CAREER AT WEST POINT.

ENTRANCES & PARKING

THE PRIMARY ADA ACCESSIBLE ENTRANCE IS THE MAIN ENTRY PLAZA AND LOCATED OFF MAIN STREET. PARKING FOR DISABLED GUESTS IS AVAILABLE ON A FIRST COME, FIRST SERVE BASIS IN THE SURROUNDING PARKING GARAGES. ADDITIONAL SPACES CAN BE FOUND AT THE CIVIC CENTER AND CENTRE. THE VEHICLE MUST DISPLAY A DISABLED PARKING PLACARD OR LICENSE PLATE.

SEATING

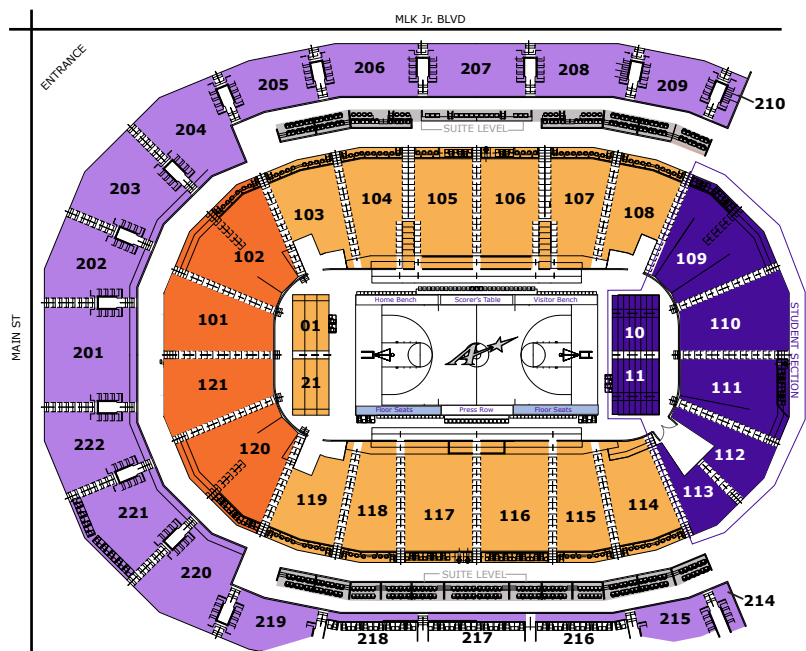
